About the Resort

- Long Beach Lodge Resort is located on eight acres of oceanfront property along Cox Bay near Tofino, between Pacific Rim National Park and Clayoquot Sound on Vancouver Island's West Coast.
- The Resort is 321 km from Victoria, 208 km from Nanaimo, 130 kilometres west of Port Alberni and 42 km north of Ucluelet on Highway 4 (Pacific Rim Highway).
- The Resort offers 5-star amenities and first class service in an informal and relaxed setting, evident in its 41 guestrooms and 20 two-bedroom cottages complete with kitchens and private hot tubs. Pet friendly rooms are available upon request. All guestrooms are non-smoking.
- Room rates range from \$199.00 CAD/\$175.00 USD - \$529.00 CAD/\$464.00 USD, depending on the season and style of room.
- The Great Room, the highlight of the resort, is a large common space with an oversized granite fireplace, exposed Douglas fir post and beam construction and a spectacular view of Cox Bay.
- The Great Room's menu features gourmet west coast cuisine handcrafted using local seafood and farm fresh Vancouver Island meats, cheeses and organic produce.

- Originally established as a fishing village, Tofino's number one industry is now tourism, with over 1 million visitors a year.
- Tofino has a year-round population of approximately 1,403, which swells to over 22,000 people in the busy summer months.
- Tofino is the official terminus of the Trans-Canada Highway.
- The Nuu-chah-nulth First Nations peoples have lived in the Tofino area for thousands of years.

About the Region

- Pacific Rim National Park Reserve stretches for over 130 km and is home to world-renowned Long Beach. Long Beach is 20 km long.
- On May 5, 2000, Clayoquot Sound was designated as British Columbia's first United Nations Biosphere Reserve.
- The Pacific Rim region of Vancouver Island is renowned for beautiful beaches, lush rainforests, whale watching, fishing, outdoor recreation and winter storm watching.
- Every year, more than 20,000 Gray whales migrate along Long Beach and the west coast of Vancouver Island. February through April are the best viewing times for northbound whales, although some whales take up residence until October.
- The drive from Victoria to Tofino was ranked as one of the three top drives in Canada in the 2004 edition of the Michelin North American Road Atlas
- Vancouver Island was named top North American island by readers of Condé Nast Traveler magazine for 2003.
